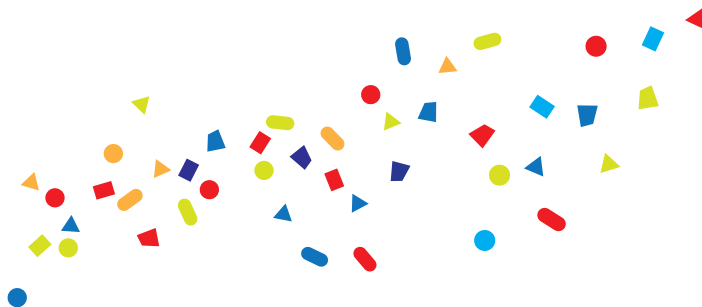

Management of chronic non-cancer pain: focus on prevention of abuse and diversion

This session offers a detailed breakdown of the issue from a Canadian perspective.

Sandra Carey, BSc. Pharm., R.Ph., session author and presenter, compiled the content to help pharmacists understand how non-cancer pain can be managed responsibly while minimizing the risk of drug diversion and prescription fraud.

- Discuss the definitions related to addiction in patients using opioids for the treatment of pain;
